THE MENACE OF THE MONSTRONS



The Daleks are besieged when the alien Monstrons invade Skaro.

he Daleks fail to detect a large spacecraft landing in a dormant volcano on Skaro. It is piloted by two Monstrons named Kenex and Yea: they are large blue aliens from an empire that enslaves worlds. They activate their robotic Engibrains, who swiftly turn the volcanic crater into a bridgehead for their invasion plans. A Dalek is dispatched on a hoverbout to investigate sounds coming from the volcano. It is captured and imprisoned inside a bubble of liquid air. Two more Dalek hoverbouts approach and crash into an invisible forcefield the Monstrons have created around the crater.



Kenex and Yeq fire missiles at the Dalek city which release a dense fog. Engibrain soldiers fly in and attack. Engibrain builders cover the entire city in liquid metal. Buildings collapse, and the Emperor Dalek is trapped in an underground river. The Emperor is threatened by a giant electric eel from the Lake of Mutations. The Daleks pull the Emperor to safety with a large magnet. The eel follows but is stunned by a Dalek. "We shall harness this creature's power until our own energy and our own machines are fresh again," the Emperor says. The electricity from the eel is syphoned by the Daleks, giving them mobility.

Back at the Monstron spacecraft, Kenex and Yeq celebrate what they believe to be a total victory. "Am I the last?" the captive Dalek thinks. "If only I could free myself, I would still prove that the Daleks are superior." It begins to heat its casing, melting the liquid air surrounding it.

It breaks free and blasts the Engibrains. "The Daleks are not destroyed!" it cries. "We are invincible!" Kenex orders the spacecraft's entry ramp retracted. The Dalek falls off the ramp and into the volcano's depths, heading towards a pool of lava. "If I am the last Dalek, I must avenge my people!" it thinks. "I know what I must do!"



At the Lake of Mutations, the Emperor leads the Daleks through a mountain tunnel to safety. "We are free again," it says. "Now we must attack and destroy our enemies before their main force can aid them!"

Inside the volcano, the lone Dalek fires at the lava pool. "I die! But I'll set off the volcano. Death to our enemies!" The volcano erupts, destroying the Monstron spacecraft and killing Kenex and Yeq. The Emperor and the other Daleks watch the eruption in the distance. They do not know what caused the volcano to erupt. "The Daleks must look forward now," the Emperor declares, "Rebuild our city... and guard against all enemies from the skies."

few months later, the Daleks have rebuilt their city and are scanning space for any further signs of hostile aliens. A space station is being built that has been positioned between Skaro and a neighbouring planet, Oric, which is rich in valuable minerals. The station is intended as a refuelling post for Dalek ships. Two Daleks working inside it witness a strange cloud in space. One of the Daleks is enveloped by it and suffers delusions. "Pictures are forming... in my brain..." it says. It turns on its comrade and destroys it, yelling, "You are an enemy! I must destroy you!" Three more

Daleks are sent to investigate. The deluded Dalek says, "More enemies disguised as Daleks! I must destroy them." It blasts them into pieces while they are still in space.


Hidden inside the cloud lies a spherical spacecraft piloted by a Mechanoid. It reports to its master, the Menoid. "Directed 'suspicion' ray at Dalek," it says. "Rebellion now in progress." The Menoid orders it to study the Daleks and observe how they deal with the crisis.

The deluded Dalek is captured and taken aboard a nearby Dalek spacecraft. It believes all the other Daleks are imposters. One suggests destroying it, but the Red Dalek Leader says, "Our radardrove has detected alien messages from nearby. An enemy caused this madness." It orders the space cloud to be blown away, and the Mechanoid ship is revealed. The Daleks destroy it before it can escape.



Two more Mechanoid ships soon appear. The Emperor watches on Skaro as they attack. The Dalek spacecraft's weapons cannot penetrate their forcefields. The ships fire on the Dalek ship, melting it. The Mechanoids broadcast a message to the Emperor: "All Daleks must avoid our skies. Soon we will come to Skaro and destroy every one of you. The Mechanoids are supreme!"

The Emperor orders a scan of the deluded Dalek's mind. They assemble an image of a Mechanoid from it. The Emperor sees how dangerous they are: "They can pierce our brains and melt our casings. We must invent new defences – improve our offensive weapons." The Emperor tells the Daleks to prepare for galactic war: "Search the skies for the inventions of other races. We must defeat the Mechanoids!"





THE ARCHVE OF PHRYNE

alek ships move through space, looking for weapons to use against the Mechanoids. They overlook the planet Phryne which is hidden behind an invisibility shield. A Phrynian called Saf contacts the world's Controller. The Phrynian leader is confident that even if their invisibility shield is pierced, the planet's actinic ray and impulse shield will protect them.

The lead Dalek on Searcher One senses that something is amiss and consults the Logic Machine. It says that the dead world they are observing is really a moon. Searcher One lands on the moon and the Daleks set up machinery to breach Phrynic's invisibility shield.

The Controller and Saf order a Phrynian space squadron to destroy the Daleks, but four of their five rockets are wiped out by Dalek missiles. The last pilot sends his rocket on a suicide course. He destroys the Daleks on the moon's surface, but Searcher One escapes and heads for Phryne's capital city. The Phrynians use their artrinic rays on the ship, but the Daleks counter it with a gamma beta ice ray. The feedback effect destroys the Phrynians' defence centre. The Controller is thrown to the floor by the explosion. "They've wrecked our defences," he says. "We can't stop them landing now."

The Dalek ship touches down. Daleks pour out and attack the Phrynians. The natives counter with an advanced cannon called an atrevolver, which kills some of the Daleks. The invaders respond with a liquid metal weapon that covers the atrevolver.

Saf and the Controller watch from the top of a building. Saf dons a jetpack,

intending to bring another atrevolver to their elevated position. But as he descends, the Controller is suddenly surprised by the Dalek leader. "You rule these people," it says: "Order their surrender or you will die now!"


Saf is hidden beneath the balcony as the Controller replies to the Dalek, "If we don't die, we'll fight. When we can't fight, we'll hide... build new weapons and fight again. That is our duty." Saf realises that the Controller's words are a message meant for him.


"The Daleks want your knowledge," the Dalek leader says. "The secret of your invisibility shield." The Controller refuses to help the Daleks. "We quard the secrets and histories of a hundred planets," he says. When the Dalek demands to know where this information is stored, the Controller replies, "In our brains. Nothing is written. Nothing is recorded. Kill us and you destroy the yesterday of an entire galaxy." The Controller jumps off the building to his death to stop the Dalek from using him.

Saf sees the Controller die. He and other Phrynians retreat to the mountains as the Daleks begin to burn down their city. "Yesterday is dead," the grieving Saf savs. "We must build for tomorrow!"









he Daleks have always based their society on the concept of 'genetic purity'. They were bred to believe that they were superior to all other species in the universe, and all non-Dalek life deserved nothing more than slavery or destruction. Nothing was more important to the Daleks than keeping themselves 'uncontaminated' by other species' genes.

As the centuries passed, inevitable changes to the Daleks' genetic make-up occurred. New generations of Dalek mutants were able to absorb and process radiation more easily than their forebears. They became more adept at transmitting energy psionically. They could withstand greater stress levels. These advancements were transferred

from one clone batch to the next. Any other intelligent species would view this as progressive evolution, but the Daleks did not. Daleks considered the earliest examples of their species to be the most 'pure'. Any deviations from the original Daleks were seen as flaws.

After their colossal losses in the Time War, the Daleks were reduced to a mere handful. They searched through time and space for a Progenitor device. Thousands of them had been created, all containing original Dalek DNA. Only one survived. The Dalek survivors of the Time War found it, but the Progenitor refused to recognise them as Daleks. However, after tricking the Doctor into identifying them as 'real' Daleks, they were able to activate the Progenitor and create five completely 'pure'

Daleks: the New Dalek Paradigm.
These Daleks were far larger than the traditional design and possessed more powerful armaments and casings.
They were defined by colour rankings.
They immediately destroyed the Daleks who had created them. The older Daleks offered no resistance, believing themselves to be inferior.

The Paradigm returned to their own point in time and began an intensive cloning operation, creating thousands of new Daleks based on their DNA. They placed most of the new Dalek mutants in the casings of the bronze Time War Daleks. The five members of the Paradigm became the template for a new hierarchy. They limited their own designs to only a select few Daleks to indicate their higher standing.



THE SUPREME

Dalek society cannot exist without a strict hierarchy. The Supreme is the uncontested leader of the Paradigm, and its commands are obeyed at all times by the other members. Its casing is white, the common colour of the Dalek ruling class. It possesses the knowledge of every Supreme Dalek in the species' history. Like the other members of the Paradiam, the Supreme's evepiece is biological, not mechanical.

THE STRATEGIST

All battle plans are designed by the Strategist. Contained within its mind are the extensive details of every campaign the Daleks have ever waged. The Strategist has a higher level of creativity and can anticipate the plans of humans and other lifeforms. It can plug itself into any Dalek battle computer via its skirting globes and witness assaults through the eyes of the Dalek drones.



THE SCIENTIST

The Daleks' lengthy history of scientific discoveries has been downloaded into the mind of the Scientist, All members of the Paradigm have devices stored at the rear of their casings that can be opened and deployed. The Scientist's casing contains advanced analysis and testing devices, including a

spectroscopic scanner, trans-dimensional sensors and neuro-wavelenath receivers. This technology effectively turns the Scientist into a living laboratory.

THE ETERNAL

With the Daleks having come so close to extinction in the Time War, their survival as a species is now of paramount importance to them. The Eternal is tasked with maintaining the Daleks' genetic history at any cost. It contains concentrated DNA samples of every significant Dalek in history. Sophisticated cloning devices are contained in the rear of its casing, enabling it to produce hundreds of Dalek embryos within a few hours.




Soldiers comprise the main population of Daleks, and the Drone is the perfect template for them. It is unquestioning and totally obedient to the other four members of the Paradigm. The rear compartment of its casing contains an impressive arsenal, including proton arenade launchers, neutronic missiles and sonic disruptors. As with all the members of the Paradigm, its gunstick is capable of total molecular disintegration.






SKIRT SECTION

ROLLER ASSEMBLY





#49-0

Take the two parts of the roller 49B and 49C. Fit them together so that the raised screw sockets on part 49C fit into recessed screw holes in part 49B. Fix them together with four LP screws.



#49-02

Ensure that all the LP screws are fully fitted so that the heads are well inside the recesses in part 49B and it is not possible to pull part 49C away from part 49B.

Storage advice

We suggest that you store the assembled roller in one of the paper bags supplied in the packaging. Label the bag with part 49A, so that you can retrieve them at a later stage of the assembly.
