global message, telling humanity to surrender. The Doctor, Jackie, Yvonne and the Cyberleader watch tensely from Torchwood Tower as the army clashes with the Cybermen.

The Black Dalek asks, "Which of you is least important?" Rose refuses to answer. Rajesh steps forward and introduces himself. He is made to kneel. "The Daleks need information about current Earth history," it says. "We will extract brainwaves." The Daleks place their suckers around Raiesh's head. He is drained dry of all life.

Two Cybermen are sent to investigate

Dalek Thay in the corridor. Both Daleks and Cybermen witness the meeting. The Doctor phones Rose, and she lets him overhear the Daleks speaking. The Cybermen propose an alliance but are rejected. Dalek Thay destroys them. The Cyberleader contacts the Black Dalek: "You have declared war upon the Cybermen," it says. The Black Dalek is unimpressed: "This is not war - this is pest control!"

Jackie and Yvonne are taken away for cyber-conversion. "This is your fault! You and your Torchwood!"" Jackie yells at Yvonne. "I did my duty... for queen and country," Yvonne says as she walks



towards the conversion machines. The Doctor and the Cyberleader are surprised by the sudden materialisation of Jake Simmonds and a team of soldiers. They destroy the handful of Cybermen with advanced weaponry. Jake explains that they found a way to travel from their parallel Earth. They all wear discs taken from their version of Torchwood. Jake takes the Doctor to his world, where he meets Pete Tyler. The Doctor tells him that moving between parallel realities is cracking the structure of the universe.



The Cybermen learn of the Cyberleader's destruction. Jackie takes advantage of their distraction and escapes before she can be converted.

Rose and Mickey watch the Daleks preparing the Genesis Ark. She remembers how the first Dalek she met was reinvigorated by her touch, drawing on the energies of a time-traveller. The Black Dalek tells them that the Genesis Ark was built by the Time Lords.



The Doctor, Jake and Pete return to the Doctor's Earth. The Doctor meets with the Cybermen and suggests an alliance.

Rose is ordered to place her hand on the Genesis Ark. She plays for time by telling the Black Dalek about the end of the Time War and how she killed the Emperor. The Doctor appears. He learns that the four Daleks are the legendary Cult of Skaro: the Black Dalek is Dalek Sec, and the others are Dalek Thay, Dalek Jast and Dalek Caan. The Doctor doesn't recognise the Genesis Ark. The the Doctor blows the doors open. Jake and the Cybermen attack. Everyone escapes, but, in the confusion, Mickey's hand touches the Genesis Ark. The



device is primed. "The Ark needs an area of 30 square miles," Dalek Sec says. Jackie is saved from the Cybermen by Pete. They are both deeply moved by the sight of their reborn spouse and fall into each other's arms.

The Daleks lead the Genesis Ark outside, battling the Cybermen and the Torchwood soldiers. The Doctor grabs two of the magnetic anchors. The Ark rises into the air above Torchwood Tower. Suddenly Daleks begin to fly out of it. "Time Lord science," the Doctor says. "It's bigger on the inside." The Cybermen on the ground fire on them, but they are no match for the new Dalek army. Pete prepares to take everyone back to his world, with the Doctor staying in this



Doctor Who showrunner and writer of Doomsday, Russell T Davies, discussed Rose Tyler's departure: "I was never tempted to kill her. We're here to tell optimistic, positive stories about the human race. Doctor Who is about survival and optimism." Rose's leaving was a major event: "She will stay in that TARDIS until she's dead. That is what her life will be. That's why it needs these

cataclysmic events to draw a line between them – literally a whole universe between them. And I just thought it needed something huge, something epic. That's what Rose, and what Billie Piper deserved as their grandstand finale."



HANGING ON



Director Graeme Harper shot the critical moment, when Rose is pulled towards the breach, in two ways. Large wind machines simulated the dragging effect as Billie Piper was pulled on a trolley across the set for the close shots. For the wider shots, a greenscreen set was used: "In order for Rose to fall, I had to have a set built that was turned around [90 degrees], so [Billie Piper] is physically hanging [on wires]. I used a slow-motion camera for that so she screams, looking up toward the camera." Harper had high praise for Billie Piper and David Tennant: "I thought the artists

were terrific... When Rose screams when she knows she's about to die, it is terrifying. It is absolutely tragic."



world to close the breach for good. The Doctor is again wearing his 3D glasses. He can see the "Void stuff" lingering on people who have made the journey between universes. He plans to open the door to the Void and pull the Daleks and Cybermen back into it. Rose refuses to leave, but the Doctor puts a disc round her neck, and she is taken to Pete's world with the others. Rose immediately iumps back to the Doctor, "I'm never gonna leave you," she says.

A group of Cybermen ascend a stairwell. planning to retreat to the other Earth. A Cyberman above them blocks their way. Without hesitation, it destroys them with an energy rifle. "I did my duty for queen and country," it says coldly.



The Doctor and Rose push the large levers and use the magnetic clamps to hold on as the breach opens again. The Daleks and the Cybermen are suddenly pulled backward into the Void. Dalek Sec says, "Emergency temporal shift!" and disappears before being caught in the deadly slipstream.

Rose's switch suddenly fails. She lets go of the clamp and tries to push it back into position. She succeeds but loses her grip. She is pulled towards the Void. The Doctor shouts in horror. Just



before she falls through the breach, Pete materialises for a split second and grabs her. They both vanish. The breach is sealed. The Doctor is left alone.

On the parallel Earth, Rose is inconsolable. "Take me back!" she screams. But the discs no longer work.

On the Doctor's Earth, he gently touches the wall, knowing that the breach can never be opened again. Silently, he turns and walks away.

Several months later. Rose hears the Doctor's voice calling her name in a dream. It leads her and her family to a



remote beach in Norway. She finds a ghostly image of the Doctor. He is inside the TARDIS, transmitting an image of himself through the last small gap in the universe. They only have two minutes to say goodbye. "I love you," Rose says through her tears. The Doctor's response to Rose is cut short as the gap closes.

Tears fall down the Doctor's face. He is suddenly confronted by an irate woman in a wedding dress standing in the TARDIS. "What the hell is this place?!" she shouts...



SAD PARTING

David Tennant recalled the crucial departure scene between the Doctor and Rose in 2014: "I remember worrying on the day we shot this scene that, as I was actually a projection from inside the TARDIS, my hair shouldn't be blowing in the wind. That seemed terribly important at the time, and although we didn't find a solution to it, it bothered me for weeks. Then I saw the finished scene, and, of course, all that matters is the end of the Doctor and Rose's story. Russell had weaved some glorious magic for two seasons, and it all came together so perfectly in this scene that people still talk to me about it with misty eyes all these years later (and I suspect they always will). Murray Gold created some heart-stopping music that accentuates the misery, and Billie [Piper] is just breathtakingly good. I feel very lucky to be standing on that beach, with my hair flying around, in amongst all these brilliant elements."







he Time War was an epic conflict that raged across all reality, devastating countless worlds. At its end, it was believed that all the Time Lords and Daleks had been destroyed. But it transpired that there were survivors on both sides, and the Daleks cheated death in several different ways...

THE LAST DALEK

The Doctor and Rose Tyler encountered a single Dalek in Utah, 2012, imprisoned in an underground complex by billionaire Henry van Statten. The Dalek had somehow slipped through a crack in space/time and crashed to Earth. Believing itself to be the last Dalek in existence, it became traumatised by the fact that it had nobody to give it orders. Directionless, it also felt itself undergoing changes to its mental functions after taking on some of the bio-energies of Rose Tyler. In the end, the confused creature took its own life.

THE EMPEROR

The Dalek Emperor's craft was the strongest in the fleet and the only one to survive the apparent destruction of Gallifrey. It fell through time, crippled


but intact. The Emperor and his few remaining Daleks hid for centuries, slowly rebuilding and harvesting the bodies of humanity to create a new Dalek species. "Only one cell in a billion was fit to be nurtured," it explained to the Doctor.

The Emperor developed a god complex, ultimately believing itself to be the creator of the universe. It met its end when Rose Tyler absorbed the power of the Time/ Space Vortex and became the Bad Wolf. She divided the atoms of the Emperor and its army, disintegrating them.

THE CULT OF SKARO

During the Time War, four Daleks were chosen by the Emperor to think beyond the normal Dalek parameters of conquest and subjugation. Their minds were altered, giving them the power to conceive ideas that would never occur to other Daleks. The Cult of Skaro proved their worth by imagining the unimaginable: the defeat of the Daleks.

The Daleks were aware of the Void: the empty area between dimensions where no time or space can exist. No life could




survive inside it, but the Cult of Skaro designed a ship that could weather its effects by duplicating them - the Void Ship likewise had no weight, no atomic mass and no radiation signature. It did not exist by any means of scientific measurement and could therefore survive inside the Void.

During the Time War, the Time Lords captured several million Daleks and imprisoned them within a dimensionally transcendental container - an object barely larger than a single Dalek on the outside, but vast and cavernous within. This prison was eventually seized by the Cult of Skaro. Renaming it the Genesis Ark, the Cult did not immediately release its deadly contents. Instead, they kept the imprisoned Daleks sealed away, preserving them as a last resort, in case the tide of war ever turned against them.

On the last day of Gallifrey, when it seemed certain that the Daleks would be utterly triumphant, the Cult of Skaro still saw the possibility of defeat. They placed the Genesis Ark inside the Void Ship and waited. Gallifrey suddenly disappeared in a blaze of energy, taking 10 million Dalek ships with it. However, the Cult avoided the blast by retreating into the Void.

It is impossible to calculate how long they existed there - the Cult had no sensation of time. When they finally reappeared in physical reality, they swiftly set about opening the Genesis Ark and releasing the Dalek army within. Only the actions of the Doctor stopped them from creating a new Dalek Empire: their army was pulled back into the Void and destroyed. But the four Cult members managed to escape using an emergency temporal shift.



DAVROS

After an encounter with the Doctor in New York, 1930, Dalek Caan was left the only survivor of the Cult of Skaro. Once again, in the face of danger, it retreated with a temporal shift. Caan flew back into the Time War and experienced the totality of time itself. The effect was so overwhelming that it caused it to go insane but also allowed it to foresee events yet to come. Caan rescued Davros from the jaws of the Nightmare Child and pulled him out of the Time War.

Davros engineered a new race of Daleks, using genetic material from his own body. But history repeated itself. The Daleks turned on him once more, pronouncing him their inferior. He was locked away in a vault inside the Dalek command ship, where he set to work creating the Reality Bomb, a weapon that could wipe out all matter in the universe. Once again, this new strand of Daleks was destroyed, this time by a duplicate of the Doctor.

THE PROGENITOR

A single Dalek ship managed to survive the attack of the duplicate Doctor and retreated in time. The three Daleks aboard went in search of a Progenitor, a small device containing pure Dalek DNA. Thousands were created during the Time War, but only one escaped destruction. The Progenitor did not acknowledge the three Daleks created from Dayros' DNA as 'true' Daleks and refused to activate for them. The Daleks solved their dilemma by tricking the Doctor into providing testimony for them. With the device activated, five new Daleks were soon created: the New Dalek Paradigm. They quickly exterminated the 'impure' Daleks who had engineered their birth.

The Doctor gained an opportunity to destroy the Paradigm Daleks, but only at the cost of the Earth's survival. He chose to let them go, aware that they would swiftly rebuild the Dalek race. From this point on, the Daleks would once again be an ongoing threat to the universe.




57A BASEPLATE LAMP REFLECTOR - TYPE A



Another reflector has been fitted to the baseplate assembly. Retain part 57B and the screws supplied until they are needed.


